
Description	Budget	Explanation
Installation of 4 inch drainage pipe under sidewalk to end of building	\$3,800.00	replace broken piping from front to back of building
Installation of a handicapped ramp at the end of the sidewalk	\$3,900.00	install a new handicapped ramp at the end of the sidewalk
Installation of 4 inch drainage pipe inside of curb and gutter	\$1,000.00	install a 4 inch pipe to sidewalk and to gutter
Asphalt entire front area parking lot	\$26,500.00	pave the front parking lot of building
Remove broken curbing and dirt on side of lot where flower bed is	\$2,900.00	remove and haul off debris from broken curb and flowerbed
Repaint parking lot lines, handicapped spaces and a new large arrow into side lot	\$2,500.00	painting of all parking spaces, handicapped space and side lot entrance
Installation of sod over disturbed areas	\$2,800.00	plant sod over dug up areas
Place dirt under side Visitor Center sidewalk	\$1,600.00	pack up existing side entrance sidewalk to prevent cracking and hazard

Please explain how these funds will be used to provide a public benefit:

Funding will be utilized to prevent water hazards that currently exist at the 96 Visitor Center. Water runoff from Hwy 34 builds up into the parking lot. The current drainage system is broken and inadequate. The sidewalk was cut to alleviate and displace water, but has created a stepping hazard. Removal of the broken curbing will prevent falls. The newly installed handicap ramp will provide access to the front of the building from the side. Currently the only handicapped ramp is in the front, creating a safety hazard as people have to go out into the roadway to go around the broken curbing. The funding will correct the previous erroneous design for the greater good of the public.


