This request will help to improve multimodal access from the Morris College area to Downtown Sumter, a major employment, shopping, and health center, for the thousands of people who live in the underserved neighborhoods surrounding Sumter's central business district. The Morris College frontage will receive updated plantings as well as cameras for safety. It will improve utilities through relocation and rehabilitation, as well as relocate overhead utilities to a safer and more aesthetically appealing location and make the North Main Street Corridor safer for pedestrians and drivers alike by addressing deficient geometry and installing new sidewalks and curbs where none currently exist. This project also has local funding in the amount of \$5,000,000 and Federal funding in the amount of \$11,400,000.
