Please explain how these funds will be used to provide a public benefit:

This State contribution is in combination with several other funding sources to complete the 40-year vision of the Lower Saluda Greenway in the unincorporated area of Lexington County near greater Irmo and the St. Andrews area. This 12ft wide Greenway will serve not only as a quality of life amenity, but also as a tool for safe pedestrian transit throughout the community, and ultimately connect the greater Irmo area to downtown Columbia with pedestrian infrastructure. The Lower Saluda Greenway will begin at the Lake Murray Dam and travel along the north side of the Lower Saluda River until it connects with the existing Saluda River Greenway, behind the Riverbanks Zoo. The Greenway will also include park amenities and multiple connecting trails to help tie the community in with the full Greenway network.


